We had several Board members attend the Philadelphia Ski Show on May 3, in Valley Forge. Since we had so many suggestions for the western trip, they took the time to meet with several tour operators and resort personnel. With airlines being less than cooperative, and pricey, destinations to Big Sky, Sun Valley or Banff were in the \$1,500 to \$1,700 range and flights out of Philadelphia and Newark had us leaving before sunrise. But we were able to snag a great deal to Summit County, Colorado, staying at Breckenridge with options to ski at Arapaho Basin and Keystone. The trip will be very affordable.

How difficult can it be to plan a bus trip to Okemo, VT.? It's pretty easy to get there, fairly complicated to sleep there. At the present time we are still searching for lodging options. Most of the on mountain hotels or condos priced accommodations higher than we typically like and we are currently exploring Ludlow Village sites. In today's economy, our goal is affordability and we still strive to offer a more economical trip than other clubs.

And talking about cheap, it's back to Pine Hill, NY for some great skiing at Belleayre and other Catskill areas. Last year we filled the Colonial Inn. So come join the fun one more time, since we may be looking at other alternatives in 2012. And speaking of the future, the Eastern Pennsylvania Ski Council is already planning trips to Waterville Valley, NH (2011), Steamboat Springs, CO. (2012) and Quebec City (2013).

So while you're on the beach, at a campground, or exploring the USA this summer, keep the York Ski Club in mind and think cool. See you at the next YSC event.
