## GREEK PEAK, NY • WEEKEND CARPOOL TRIP

January 10-12, 2014

Our first trip of the season is a return to Greek Peak, NY. The trip includes two nights lodging at the Ramada Inn in Cortland, NY (Fri. and Sat.), a 2-day lift ticket to Greek Peak (Sat. & Sun.) and two breakfasts at the Ramada Inn (Sat. and Sun.) including gratuities. The contract for lodging remains outstanding; trip price is expected to be about \$290 or less, based on double-occupancy.

## TAOS, NM February 22- March 1, 2014

We are returning to Taos, NM for another "Learn to Ski Better" week. This trip includes daily morning lessons for 2.5 hours, video analysis and a visit to a "special tree" at the end of the week. Those that went in 2010 all picked up tips to improve their skiing. Each morning you will ski with a small group of skiers of equal ability. It doesn't matter if you ski double blacks with ease or are a beginner or intermediate skier you can always use that extra help to improve your skills. You will have the same instructor for the week so they will be able to pick out your strengths and weaknesses on all types of slopes and all types of conditions. At the end of this trip everyone should see improvement in their skiing ability and the confidence to tackle a slope they

found intimidating the first day. The afternoons you are on your own to practice your new skills or just sit in the lodge and brag to your friends what slopes you mastered.

The price of \$1749 includes R/T air and ground transportation, 7 nights lodging at the Snakedance Condos which are ski in/ski out, Continental breakfast, ski storage with boot dryers, Welcome party and 5 of 6 day lift with lessons each day. Plus dinner at the General Managers house (which is beautiful) and of course your vest.

## TIMBERLINE/CANNAN, WV • February 06-10, 2014

### Trip Leader: Tim Rodencal

Trip includes 4 nights and 2 Day lift tickets providing maximum flexibility. Min. of 18 with a Max. of 24 people. Would like 20 people for group lift ticket pricing. Trip price \$280 per person for Thursday thru Monday with a Friday night pizza party included. Non-Skier price only \$200.

Carpool to Davis, WV with friends on Thursday 2/06/14 after work. We will be staying in 3 of the Deluxe Cottages at Cannan Valley Resort State Park, just a few miles from Timberline and Cannan Valley ski areas. These four bedroom, two bath cottages are complete with full kitchens, fireplace and cable TV and are located in the State Park with miles of trails right out the front door to cross country ski or snowshoe. We will most likely ski Timberline (1000' vertical) as a group on Friday. Rent cross

country skis, snowshoes, or ski the resorts on Saturday. There is nearly a million acres of wilderness around this area with easy access to trails at our cottages in the State Park. Chip and myself will lead a beginner/intermediate backcountry tour (approx 3 hours) from Cannan Resort to White Grass Ski Touring area, which has to be seen to be appreciated! First timers welcome. On Sunday we will ski Cannan (850 vertical) as a group. On Monday, ski Cannan once more for the low price of \$15 (with a can of food as a donation), not include in price, snowshoe, cross country ski, or visit frozen Blackwater Falls (temperature dependent), a short drive from the resort. Head for home in the afternoon.

Snowmaking and peak elevation of over 4200 feet for both resorts ensure there will be plenty of snow for your outdoor

activities. Two Micro-Brew pubs are nearby in Thomas, and Davis WV. Cook in, or dine out at one of the many restaurants in the area. With all the options available on this trip, it will be hard to beat the price for this 4 night excursion.

Other things to do in the area: Seneca Rocks and Caves, Dolly Sods Wilderness Area, Ice Skating, Horseback riding (year around), Glass blowing studio, and Snow tubing. Ski Wisp on the way down Thursday, or on the way home on Monday.

## UTAH • March 8 - 15, 2014

We will stay in 2 connected Ski Houses in Salt Lake City at the base of Big Cottonwood Canyon for the week of March 8 (Saturday) through March 15th, 2014. They are very convenient for skiing Alta, Snowbird, Brighton and Solitude. Park City, Deer Valley, and The Canyons are a 35 minute ride. Powder Mountain, Snow Basin, and Sundance are an hour.

We will again rent cars for every 4 - 5 people on the trip. That gives us lots of flexibility to ski different areas on the same day, and non-skiers can have a car for the day to do whatever. There are plenty of things to do in SLC for non-skiers.

The cost of the trip will be \$1000.00 per person for Airfare (non-stop round trip from BWI), Lodging, and Car Rental.

Lift Tickets are extra, and average approximately \$58.00 per day at the Lift House (2012 rate), right down the street from the ski houses. 3, 4, 5 and 6 day passes are available at a discounted rate through our landlord. The multiple day passes are good at the Salt Lake resorts and some of the others. More on that later. We will buy lift tickets as a group after we know where and how much everyone wants to ski.

Food will be on your own. The houses have nice, large kitchens with full cooking facilities, and there are hundreds of restaurants within a 20 minute drive of the house. It is a 15 - 20 minute drive to downtown SLC.

This is a first-come, first serve trip. The trip is strictly limited to 20 people, with a minimum of 16. I will start taking money at the Club Picnic on July 28. The first



installment is \$350.00. The next will be \$350.00 in September. The balance (\$300.00) will be due in November. Make checks payable to: York Ski Club. Fill out a trip form (available on the website) and send with check to: Chip Konrad 480 Ivory Rd., York, Pa. 17402.

**The Spring Fling carpool trip has returned to the York Ski Club schedule next year. Lodging has been locked in at Eagles at Sugarbush, in Waitsfield, VT. 3. Discount lift tickets will be ordered at the February 18, 2014 YSC meeting for pickup at the March 18, 2014 meeting.
4. The trip is limited to the first 8 people to sign up.

5. Signups post-marked prior to August 1, 2013 will not be accepted.
6. You must be a YSC member for the 2012-2013 season and the preceding four years. (Membership has its benefits).
7. There will be no refunds on lodging or tickets.
8. Lodging must be paid in full at sign up.
9. Can't stay the whole week? You may sublet your bed space to a qualified member with approval of the trip leader and roommate.
10. Master suites will be assigned to the first two couples who sign up.
11. Your trip application must accompany your \$60 lodging payment.
12. If you have not renewed, separate checks for your club membership application for 2013-2014 season and for the trip are required.
13. There is no waiting list.
