2009/2010 YORK SKI RESORT AND TOURISM AWARDS

1. New Jersey Scenic Award - Several months before Snoweast Magazine published the results of the 2009 Annual Reader's Survey, they released the results to Ski Clubs on 7/15/09. The favorite scenic view went to Wildcat, NH. The runner-up was Wildcat, NJ.
2. Warren Rolls Over Award - The National Ski Federation publishes an email newflash letters on the fifth day of every month. In October, they plugged the new Warren Miller's film "Children in Winter". Unfortunately, that was the 2008 film release, not "Dynasty". A correction was issued about 20 minutes later.
3. Avalanche Unexpress Award - Heritage Hills Resort got an early season start when night time temperatures dropped and they began to make snow on Saturday, Nov. 7, 2009 and Sunday, Nov. 8, 2009. Unfortunately, temperatures on Sunday peaked at 74° and someone forgot to turn off the snow gun, so it was only shooting water in the late afternoon.
4. Win Some, Lose Some Award - Killington opened their 2009-2010 season on November 11, 2009, but closed on November 12, 2009.
5. Lost Trail Map Award - Jay Peak opened 12/5/09 about 3 weeks later than normal. Even with the delay the new trail maps were not available. Granted, they only had on trail open, but you had to cross three bare trails, walk around the Jay Peak Ski Clubhouse and cross a stream to find the Jet Triple Chair.
6. Anti Canadian Award - To encourage Quebec residents to cross the U. S. Border, Jay Peak used to accept Canadian currency at par with the U. S. Dollar. With the new lodge, Jay Peak now posts the accepted exchange rate. They have also posted a sign that requires evidence of Canadian residency to pay with Canadian money.
7. You Can't Get There From Here Award - The I Love New York Winter magazine from 2009-2010 shows the location of over 100 downhill & cross country ski areas. The map however shows you driving thru Hunter to get to Belleayre.
