

**SUN VALLEY**  
FEBRUARY 9 TO 16, 2013  
**\$1,399.00 PP/DO**

It's easy to imagine the reaction of the skiers who first gazed out onto the awe inspiring Sawtooth Range. Sun Valley is a down hill paradise found with more than 3400 vertical feet and over 2000 acres of varied terrain. Bald Mt features the consistency of pitch - lack of lift lines and a variety of terrain. A total of 13 chair lifts and 65 varied runs await skiers and boarders. Adding to the "Baldy" this season are 30 acres of glade skiing terrain for all. Also available to skiers and non-skiers is the new gondola which will take you to the Roundhouse Lodge.

We will be staying at the Christophe Condos within walking distance to the River Run Plaza (lifts) and downtown. Don't want to walk - ride the bus.

Mt Rides provides free bus service through-out the town and to the slopes.

With all the restaurants, bars and shops - apres ski and night life will keep you busy. One more tip: No Sun Valley trip is complete without taking the sleigh ride to the Trail Creek Cabin for a sumptuous dinner in the historic cabin built in 1937.

This year's carpool trip is to **Windham Mountain**. Accommodations include lodging Friday and Saturday nights at the Windwood Inn, and skiing Saturday and Sunday. A hearty continental breakfast is included in the stay package along with a two-day lift package. Extended stay options are available for those interested.

A shuttle bus will provide transportation to and from the mountain. The mountain boasts a vertical rise of 1,600 feet with a 2 mile long trail called the Wonderer. In addition to skiing and snowboarding, Windham offers snow tubing, ice skating, XC skiing and snowshoeing.

Windham is once again offering a "Ski Club Card" that entitles you to a lift ticket for \$25 dollars that can be used the Friday before check in.

Trip pricing is -\$275pp double occupancy.

As always, arrangements can be made for early arrivals and those wishing to rent equipment. To ensure your spot, a deposit of \$100.00 pp will reserve your space. The second payment of \$100.00 pp is due by October 16, 2012. The balance and final payment is due by November 20, 2012.

# BLUE MOUNTAIN DAY TRIP

January 13, 2013

Blue Mountain is big enough to offer something for everyone. With its 39 trails, they have increased chairlift capacity and mastered the art of snow making. For the skiers/boarders with a riskier appetite, "Blue" offers terrain parks, a snow cross trail with banked turns, and plenty of trails to meet your needs.

Blue Mountain is fun for the whole family. Even the diehard "Big Dogs" will get a thrill from their lightning-speed tubing runs. They have family sized tubes and solo tubes...Their tubing hill offers 3 lifts and 21 slides...

If that is not enough, "Blue" offers a "Big Air Bag" for those who have ice in their veins. The Big Air Bag will be open on Sunday's from 11am-8pm---at an additional cost of \$25.00 (not included in our club package).

The Day trip includes the lift ticket and light snacks during the lunch hour. Car pooling is encouraged and a strong attempt to coordinate ridership will occur during the weeks leading up to the trip. ## MORE GORE

Saturday, March 9 thru Tuesday, March 12, 2013

The decision is final. The YSC will be skiing MORE days at Gore Mountain, NY than any prior trip this destination. We will also save you MORE vacation time by leaving a day earlier than our normal bus trip. That's right, we will travel on Saturday and ski Gore on Sunday and Monday. There will be an option to ski or board one MORE half-day on Tuesday before departing for home.

Gore Mountain has slopes for every type of skier or rider. The mountain has 95 slopes, covering over 40 miles and 437 acres of fun. The trail ratings are 13% easiest, 53% more difficult and 34% most difficult. With a peak elevation of 3600', a 2537' vertical drop (6<sup>th</sup> greatest in the East); great snowmaking, 5 terrain parks; and 21 glade areas, this will be an exciting trip. Oh, and here's a rumor that the "Rumor" slope is the steepest train in the East. There is even an interconnecting trail with the historic North Creek Ski Bowl and 8 cross-country and snowshoeing trails too!

### Trip Includes:

3 Nights Lodging the Copperfield Inn, a luxurious Resort in downtown North Creek, NY. It is the premier resort with an outdoor hot tub and a fitness club on-site. The resort offers shuttle service to all area slopes and has two on-site restaurants.

Transportation by Conestoga Tours from York to North Creek on Saturday, March 9, 2013. While the YSC does not provide beverages, you are welcome to bring your own beer, wine or other drinks.

2-Day lift ticket (1/2 day ticket option for Tuesday morning)

The Cost is only \$465 pp/do, which includes all of the above plus taxes and gratuity. Non-skier discounts available and there will be reduced lift pricing for juniors, teens and seniors (69+)


