Nine of us did a side trip through Poughkeepsie, NY to visit the Half-Time Beverage, the world's largest beer distributor. We figured we bought about 60 + different beer varieties. The warehouse has quite a selection and several beers were on tap there. It's funny that the "beer capital of the world" is also the home base for the Norman Vincent Peale Organization (he was a religious author and televangelist).

We arrived at The Copperfield Inn Resort just after dark and headed across the street to a local bar, The Barking Spider. Bacon Cheeseburgers were only \$4.50. Service was slow and only two orders came out at a time. We figured there was either a shortage of dishes or cooks to prepare the burgers on a George Foreman Grill in the basement.
