

NORTHERN VERMONT BUS TRIP

Saturday 02/07/15 – Wednesday 02/11/15



Time Frame: The York Ski Club (YSC) has scheduled a bus trip in February 2015. We have added an extra day and a third ski area to our itinerary. YSC has combined the three resorts with, historically, the greatest natural snow accumulation on the east coast. Avoid most weekend crowds by skiing/boarding Sunday through Wednesday on over 250 different trails at Jay Peak, Smuggler's Notch, and Stowe, VT. It's been 1991 since YSC has been on a trip to Smuggler's Notch.

Lodging: On Saturday night, we will be staying at the Quality Inn in Shelbourne with your choice of one king or two double beds. The Quality Inn has an indoor pool, fitness center, in room microwave/refrigerator, and premium TV channels. We will be staying in Stowe at the Town and Country Resort on Sun., Mon., and Tues. All rooms have two double beds, TV, phones, and a private bath. Guests may use indoor pool, hot tub, and fitness center. Full breakfast is included daily at the Carriage Room Restaurant. Complimentary hor d'oeuvres may be available in the Fireside Pub for the ski group from 4:30 pm to 6:30 pm.

The Slopes: On Sunday, we plan to ski Jay Peak, which is the snow capital of the East and averages 370" annually (sometimes over 700"). Jay Peak has 485 acres, 76 slopes/glades/chutes, and 9 lifts (including a 60 passenger tram). The summit elevation is 3,968' with a vertical drop of 2,153'. The trail makeup is 20% novice, 40% intermediate, and 40% advanced. There is 5 lifts with access to the Beginner Zone with 80 acres of gentle, wide, easy to maneuver slopes. But the 100 acres of off-piste skiing is the reason some of the best skiers visit Jay Peak.

On Monday we will travel to Smuggler's Notch. The resort has three mountains with 78 trails on 310 acres and over 750 acres of woods between the trails. Morse Mountain is 2,250' high with a vertical drop of 1,220' with mostly beginner trails. Madonna Mountain is 3,640' high and has a vertical drop of 2,620'. Sterling Mountain, which actually abuts Spruce Peak, is 3,040' high with a vertical drop of 2,010'. There are 8 lifts, none of which have been upgraded since at least 1991. The trail mix is 19% easier, 50% more difficult, 25% more difficult, and 6% double/triple black diamond runs. This may be America's Family Resort, but with over 1,000 acres of terrain, this place can kick butt. There is also a zip line canopy tour available.

On Tuesday, we will ski at Stowe Mountain. Stowe has a vertical drop of 2,360' and 108 named trails on 485 skiable areas. The longest run is 3.7 miles (Toll Road). Average yearly snowfall is 333" and snow making coverage is 80%. Slope difficulty ranges from 16% beginner, 59% intermediate, and 25% advanced. Mount Mansfield and

Spruce Peaks are served by 12 lifts, including 8 person high speeding gondola. Stowe offers bumps, steep, and off trail adventures for those daring enough to try. Spruce Peak is an excellent beginner area. Last year, Stowe Mountain had just completed its \$250 million 10 year redevelopment effort.

Entertainment: If there are not any travel delays, we plan to tour Magic Hat Brewery before check-in Saturday afternoon near Burlington, Vt. If time permits on Monday, we may stop at Rock Art Brewery in Morrisville. Then on our way home on Wednesday, the search is for Heady Topper beer in Waitsfield, VT.

The Town and Country Resort is located on Mountain Road, about 1½ miles from the Village of Stowe. You can walk to restaurants or take the town shuttle. Stowe has shops, movies, and over 50 restaurants. You can make arrangements for horse-drawn sleigh rides, snowmobiling, and snowshoeing. All three ski areas have cross-country skiing.

Late Sunday at Jay Peak, you can dine at one of several restaurants or play in the waterpark. The Pump House Indoor Waterpark is 60,000 glorious square feet of watery-heaven with pee-your pants-with-excitement thrills like the 65' drop of La Chute and the Double Barrel Flowrider that made the Travel Channel's top ten coolest waterpark rides ever. And if you prefer your liquid in a glass, take in the action from "The Drink" poolside bar or "The Warming Shelter" snack bar. Indoor ice skating is also available at Jay Peak.

Transportation: Smoke Free, 56 passenger Conestoga Tour Coach with restroom and lots of video time. Bring your own beer and wine, but remember no glass bottles on the bus.

Package Includes: 4 nights lodging, 3 day lift ticket, transportation to VT and return, side trips to Jay Peak, and Smuggler's Notch, resort shuttle runs to Stowe base area on Tues., 3 full breakfasts at the Town and Country Resort, one continental breakfast at the Quality Inn, Shelbourne, plus all taxes and gratuities.

Trip Cost: \$679 pp/double occupancy; \$641 pp/triple occupancy
\$616 pp/quadruple occupancy; \$825 pp/single occupancy
\$200 discount for non-skiers/non-boarders
No additional discounts for children or seniors
